National Trust for Historic Preservation Awards Friends of Eagle Island, Inc. A Preservation Grant *Towards Architectural Drawings for Eagle Island Camp* 

Saranac Lake, NY (January 23, 2017)— In October 2016, Friends of Eagle Island, Inc. was awarded a \$10,000 grant by the National Trust for Historic Preservation from the Hart Family Fund for Small Towns. These grant funds will be used to match local funds to help support the Architectural Drawings for Eagle Island Camp project.

"Organizations like Friends of Eagle Island, help to ensure that communities and towns all across America retain their unique sense of place," said Stephanie Meeks, president of the National Trust for Historic Preservation. "We are honored to provide a grant to Friends of Eagle Island, which will use the funds to help preserve an important piece of our shared national heritage."

Grants from the National Trust Preservation Funds range from \$2,500 to \$10,000 and have provided over \$15 million since 2003. These matching grants are awarded to nonprofit organizations and public agencies across the country to support wide-ranging activities including consultant services for rehabilitating buildings, technical assistance for tourism that promotes historic resources, and the development of materials for education and outreach campaigns.
