# WORK ON RESTORATION & REPAIRS OF SIX BUILDINGS TO BEGIN

Eagle Island is excited to announce that it has entered into a contract with Adirondack Building Restoration, Inc. (ABR) for critical restoration and repair work on six key buildings (family cabin/administrative office, main lodge, dining pavilion, kitchen/staff building, laundry, and guide house/infirmary). El sought competitive bids, and ABR was the lowest bidder. ABR has substantial experience working with historic properties in the Adirondacks.

ABR expects to start work in mid-August with two work crews of three men each. ABR will provide a third crew as needed. Work will include: repair and stabilization of the foundations and supporting members of several buildings; excavation and preparation work in the dining pavilion basement for the water storage and treatment system that will be part of a second contract; substantial work on the kitchen building, including readying it for the later installation of the refurbished kitchen as part of a separate contact; re-roofing of some portions of buildings; masonry repairs; and restoration of some historic architectural features. ABR will coordinate its work with that being done by volunteers and other contractors, and expects to complete all of the contract work by late fall.

Simultaneously, we now working on awarding a contract for the water and septic system reconstruction, with the goal of having a substantial portion of that work completed this construction season as well. These contracts will get us much closer to our soft reopening in the summer of 2019!
